A dog owner himself, Dr. Modiano will share with us the latest advances in his research lab, specifically regarding hemangiosarcoma. He is eager to field your questions about this perplexing disease, explain how this cancer works and manifests, and discuss what we can do about it. Dr. Modiano will also be on hand at the VCA Welfare Foundation table during breed judging to meet our Vizsla community.

Jaime Modiano, VMD, PhD, is a Professor of Comparative Oncology, holds the AI and June Perlman Endowed Chair, and serves as Director of the Animal Cancer Care and Research Program of the College of Veterinary Medicine and Masonic Cancer Center at the University of Minnesota. Dr. Modiano's lab focuses on understanding how and why cancer happens and on translating basic research into clinical applications to improve the health and well-being of companion animals and humans. His research interests include cancer genetics, cancer immunology, and tumor-microenvironment interactions as well as developments in diagnostics and therapeutics. Dr. Modiano's work is funded by the National Institutes of Health and by various nonprofit foundations and includes ongoing collaborations with scientists within and outside the United States.
