About the Inn – 20 minutes from Host Hotel

Centered in the heart of Concord's Monument Square since 1716, the Inn has been a vital part of historic Concord and played an integral role in America's Revolutionary War. It was from here the militiamen mustered to meet the British troops at the North Bridge nearby, which was pivotal in securing America's independence.

Concord was later the epicenter of philosophy and home to Legendary Authors like Ralph Waldo Emerson, Henry David Thoreau, Nathaniel Hawthorne, Bronson Alcott, and his daughter Louisa May Alcott, all of whom lived and wrote in Concord, and visited the Inn often. The spirit of the past is vibrantly alive at Concord's Colonial Inn and in the heart of Concord.
